# **Customs Procedures for Inbound Air Passengers to Thailand\***

### **Nothing to Declare (Green Channel)**

Personal belongings which are worth no more than THB 20,000 and are not for commercial purpose















No more than 1 litre of alcoholic beverages





No more than 200 cigarettes

No more than 250 g of cigars or tobacco

No more than 250 g of all types combined (Each passenger is allowed the maximum of 200 cigarettes in any cases)

### **Goods to Declare (Red Channel)**

Personal belongings which exceed THB 20,000 or are for commercial purpose (even with the value of less than THB 20,000)













More than 1 litre of alcoholic beverages

More than 250 g of cigars or tobacco







### **Customs Procedure at the Red Channel**

The Customs officer assesses the value for duties and taxes.








