



Blue Card (EU) Visa tertiary-level qualification

(Section 18g Residence Act)

Basic information

- Please see basic information on applying for a visa on our website. **Applications can only be submitted via the [Consular Services Portal](#).**
- The German mission is only competent should you have your permanent residence in Tanzania
- Documents not in the German language must be submitted with a certified German translation. A translation of the personal data page of the passport is, however, not required.
- Certificates, diplomas, etc. must be presented in the original with apostille/legalization.
- The visa must, where applicable, be approved by the Federal Employment Agency and the competent foreigners authority. The visa can only be issued when these approvals have been received.
- **Processing time is circa six weeks** but can take longer in individual cases.
- Flight reservations are not required to apply for a visa – please only book when you have received your visa and refrain from booking before.
- The mission abroad reserves the right to request further documents at all times.
- Missing documentation delays the procedure and can result in your application being rejected.
- **Please do not contact the mission abroad to check the status of your application during the normal processing period.** Such inquiries are extremely time-consuming for the visa section and can thus not be answered.

General information

To apply for the Blue Card (EU) with **tertiary-level qualification** in Germany you will need

- a tertiary-level qualification that took at least three years to complete, corresponding to level 6 of either ISCED 2011 or the European Qualifications Framework. Some examples of professions that can be achieved through a tertiary education program are technical specialist, commercial specialist, specialist with a master craftsman's certificate, pedagogical specialist and therapeutic specialist. - a contract of employment (at least six months) in Germany corresponding to your qualifications and
- a minimum annual gross salary of EUR 48.300,- (in 2025).

In these cases, the consent of the Federal Employment Agency is required.

In 2025, the minimum salary requirements are: → 48.300 € gross annually for all other occupations.	
<input type="checkbox"/> Proof of completion of tertiary qualification: all pages, original; Submit a certificate confirming that you have completed tertiary education. The training must be assigned to subgroup "65 vocationally oriented" of level 6 of the International Standard Classification of Education (ISCED). Courses in this subgroup last at least three years. More information: ISCED 2011 . This document must be provided with a legalisation on the original. Further information on legalisations .

It is important that the letter of recognition states clearly that your training is assigned to level 6 of the International Standard Classification of Education (ISCED) otherwise you do not qualify for this visa category
