You are advised to secure your admittance or acceptance from the univversity as early as possible. During your studies, you can take up student jobs to help cover your expenses. Upon completing your studies, you will have the opportunity to look for a job.

Before booking an appointment, please prepare the following documentation for your visa. The following documents are to be submitted **personally** at the Embassy **after booking** an appointment.
